Course Description

The Spring Course is devoted to a review of the most compelling topics discussed during Digestive Disease Week® 2022. Our distinguished faculty will select and present the most important information about new drugs and drug therapies; medical, surgical and endoscopic treatments for disease, and the social impact of disease states pertaining to gastroenterology, endoscopy, and liver disease. The etiology and pathophysiology of disease states as well as the epidemiology of diseases will also be included.

Digestive Disease Week® is the most important academic forum in gastroenterology. The Spring Course: Best of DDW 2022 will present an excellent summary of DDW topics and include video of new endoscopic techniques.

Learning Objectives

- Examine the diagnostic and expanded therapeutic capabilities of ERCP and EUS to detect and treat disorders of the hepatobiliary tract, pancreas, and luminal gastrointestinal tract and to detect and manage suspected small bowel bleeding
